KS1 Boats and Ships Bundle | Teaching Resources

Set out the boat-making materials. Encourage children to be creative with their boat-making. Ask children to take their completed boats to the water table. Explain that some boats may float and others may not and that if their boat doesn't float, they can make another one. Ask children to observe which boats float and which ones sink.
